



## **EVALUATE THE PROCESS**

## **ASSESSING ADVOCACY EFFORTS**

#### **Executive**

Was an Executive Order issued?

Where comments published/cited as reason for change?

Are appointments reflective of your recommendations?

## **Legislative**

Have legislative committees invited you to testify?

Are you asked to join the process of drafting legislation?

Has a law passed that resolves the issue completely or in part?

### **Judicial**

Has a case been resolved that expands or protects the rights of the community you serve?

Did a judge used your brief in drafting his or her judicial opinion?

#### **Electorate**

Has voter registration/turnout increased?

Have voters enacted laws through petitions?


